Practice tender-hearted mercy and kindness to others.

Don't worry about making a good impression.

Be ready to suffer quietly and patiently.

Be gentle and ready to forgive.

Let love guide your life.

Let the peace of heart that comes from Christ be always present in your hearts and lives.

Always be thankful.

Remember what Christ taught, and let his words enrich your lives.

Whatever you do or say, let it be as a representative of the Lord Jesus.

I challenge us all to follow these as our guidelines for 2019 so that we might live together in harmony as a community and in the wider world.














# Joint Holy Communion Service & Fellowship at Calahonda

## **Chalking the Door**

At the All Age Service on Epiphany Sunday we talked about the Custom of Chalking the door. This is a part of church history which involves the blessing of homes at the New Year. A family would hold a short service of prayer to ask God's blessing on their dwellings and on all who live, work with and visit them.

If we choose to adopt this custom we invite Jesus to be a "guest" in our home, a listener to each conversation, a guide for troubled times, and a blessing in times of thanksgiving.

This year the home would be marked on the lintel above the door with 20 + C + M + B + 19.



The numbers refer "to the calendar year 20 19, the crosses stand for Christ; and the letters have two meanings: C, M and B are the initials for the traditional names of the Magi (Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar), but they are also an abbreviation of the Latin blessing *Christus mansionem benedicat*, which means, May Christ bless this house.





Revd John Ball blessed the chalk then, as they left church, everyone was given a bag containing a piece of chalk and a short prayer to use at home.
